GENERAL SERVICES

Call Center and Crisis Call Center (24/7/365)

Bartholomew, Brown, Clark, Decatur, Jackson, Jefferson and Jennings, Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen Counties: 800.344.8802

Ages: All

The main call center assists individuals in locating and obtaining needed behavioral health services by selecting the resources that are the most appropriate for their needs. All initial appointments are set through this service. This team also serves as a resource to the public through provision of information regarding behavioral health services.

Individuals experiencing a mental health crisis may call this number 24/7/365 to receive rapid assistance, or they may call any clinic number.

Locations: Bartholomew, Brown, Clark, Decatur, Jackson, Jefferson, Jennings, Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan, and Owen counties

Consultation and Evaluation Services

Ages: All

Evaluations are provided to children, adolescents and adults to determine severity of problem and recommended treatments. They are conducted by a Masters-level clinician or psychologist. Consultation services are generally focused on future treatment recommendation and are provided upon discharge or request by Bloomington Hospital or area jail.

Locations: Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan, Owen Counties

Intake Clinics

Ages: All

Intake clinics are available at select clinics on specified days and hours for patients to be seen on a first-come, first serve basis for an initial evaluation. Individuals seeking an initial evaluation should present 1.5 hours before the ending time to ensure enough time for registration and evaluation. We cannot guarantee that all people who present to a given walk-in will be seen that day. Initial clinical evaluations are not medication evaluations.

Locations: Bartholomew, Decatur, Jackson, Jefferson, Jennings, Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan, and Owen counties

Outpatient Counseling Services

Ages: All

Professional staff provide individual, family, couples, and group counseling and therapy services including, but not limited to: depression, stress, anxiety, divorce, anger management, and grief.

Locations: All Centerstone outpatient clinics

Psychiatric Evaluations & Medication Management

Ages: All

Centerstone provides comprehensive psychiatric evaluation and medication management to adult, adolescent and child clients with substance abuse and psychiatric diagnosis. Medication evaluation and monitoring is typically started after the consumer's initial evaluation with the intake therapist is reviewed, and the treatment team determines that a medical evaluation is in order. Evaluations and ongoing medication management are done by staff psychiatrists and clinical nurse specialists.

Locations: All Centerstone outpatient clinics

PROGRAMS & SPECIALIZED SERVICES

Alcohol and Drug Treatment

Adolescent Brief Intensive Group (BIG)

Ages: 12-18

BIG is a group that focuses on the impact of drugs and alcohol in the client's life. The group utilizes substance information and drug education in addition to drug screens and other measures to provide clients with resources to evaluate their drug and alcohol use. During the 6-8 week course, clients learn about the difference between use, abuse, and dependence; triggers; identifying high risk situations; thinking distortions; dealing with cravings; and more. Group members are required to complete a change plan before graduating from group. Referrals can be made from correctional, educational and familial systems.

Location: Monroe County

Adolescent Drug Education Class (ADEC)

Ages: 12-18

ADEC is an 8-hour lecture class to educate participants about aspects of substance use and abuse. The class focuses on the effects that substance use has on the individual, society, family, education, and employment. ADEC is for adolescents who do not show signs of abuse or dependence, but who do show signs of experimentation and are experiencing consequences. Referrals are often from correctional and educational agencies.

Location: Monroe County

Adolescent Matrix Intensive Outpatient Program (Matrix IOP)

Ages: 13-18

Matrix IOP is a 16-week intensive and comprehensive evidence-based therapeutic model intended for adolescents meeting criteria for substance dependence. The adolescent Matrix Model consists of research-based techniques integrated into an approach that includes individual, family and group sessions and separate parent and adolescent substance-education groups. Referrals can be made from correctional, educational, and familial systems.

Locations: Bartholomew and Monroe counties

Aftercare

Ages: 18 and older

Aftercare is an 8-week group which is intended to support, monitor and integrate the information clients have learned in IOP. Completion of IOP or its equivalent is required. Clients must be attending 3 12-step meetings a week and have a sponsor. This group is not intended for clients who are chronic substance users with difficulty remaining sober despite multiple treatment episodes and substantial consequences.

Locations: Bartholomew, Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

Beginner's Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP)

Ages: 18 and older

Beginner's Intensive Outpatient Program is part of the continuum of care for clients who meet dependence criteria, have had little to no substance treatment history, have had little to no education about substances, and have had little to no sober support. The program is staffed by addictions team members and a therapist.

Location: Monroe County

Co-occurring Disorders Treatment

Ages: 18 and older

Co-occurring Disorders Treatment is for adults who have a mental illness and a substance use disorder. The program is evidence-based, and treatment addresses issues such as drug interaction, relapse, and overlapping symptoms. The program offers intensive outpatient therapy (including individual and group counseling), intensive case management, psychiatric treatment, medication management services, supportive services, family education and counseling, coordination with physical health services, rapid HIV testing, and aftercare referrals. Initial assessment and evaluation required.

Service Locations: Monroe and Clark counties

Counties Served: Bartholomew, Brown, Clark, Decatur, Jackson, Jefferson, Jennings, Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen

Day Treatment

Ages: 18 and older

Day Treatment is typically a 2-week program for persons who are substance dependent or unable to stop using drugs and/or alcohol. This program provides clients with education and information about substances, their effects, 12-step programs, and more. Day Treatment is a beginning program with the purpose of motivating and preparing the client for further treatment. Clients participating in Day Treatment are required to attend six AA/NA meetings weekly. The program is staffed by the Addictions Team and a therapist.

Location: Monroe County

Forensic Diversion Program

Ages: Adult Males

The Southern Indiana Forensic Diversion Program is an intensive residential treatment program. It serves up to 15 male offenders. The program is dedicated to providing treatment alternatives for chemically dependent offenders who have long-standing histories of chemical dependency coupled with criminal behaviors and, in some cases, co-occurring mental illness. Services are located in the Clark County Community Correction facility in Jeffersonville, Indiana. Participation includes individual therapy, group therapy, education groups, individualized treatment, psychiatric consultations when appropriate, referrals for vocational training, housing and social services, aftercare monitoring for up to nine months in a home community or placement setting, and periodic reporting to the referral source as appropriate.

Service Location: Jeffersonville, Indiana (Clark County)

Counties Served: Bartholomew, Brown, Clark, Crawford, Dearborn, Floyd, Harrison, Jackson, Jefferson, Jennings, Lawrence, Monroe, Ohio, Orange, Ripley, Scott, Switzerland and Washington

IOP (Intensive Outpatient Program) and Alternative to Addictions for Substance Abuse

Ages: 18 and older

This program uses a twelve-step model for treatment of moderate-stage chemical dependency. The program includes a co-dependent group component. The number of hours and sessions per week varies by location.

Locations: Bartholomew, Brown, Clark, Decatur, Jackson, Jefferson and Jennings Counties

Living Sober/12 weeks

Ages: 18 and older

Living Sober is a 12-week group which is intended to support, monitor and integrate the information clients have learned in IOP. Clients are expected to attend three AA/NA meetings each week and have regular sponsor contact while in treatment. Clients will learn how to manage the ongoing challenges related to triggers, cravings, risky situations, sober support and life stresses.

Location: Bartholomew County

Living Sober/24 weeks

Ages: 18 and older

Living Sober is a 24-week group which is intended for clients who have difficulty remaining sober despite multiple treatment episodes and substantial consequences. The purpose of the program is to support, monitor and integrate the information that clients have learned in IOP. Completion of IOP or its equivalent is required. Clients who participate in Drug Court are required to attend this group. Clients must be involved in 12-step meetings (attend 3 meetings a week) and have a sponsor.

Location: Monroe County

Matrix Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP)

Ages: 18 and older

Matrix IOP is at the other end of the continuum of care for clients who meet the criteria for dependence. This IOP is more intensive and longer than the Beginners or Standard IOP programs. It is highly structured and focused on education. This group is for clients who have attended IOP in the past and appear to need a high level of structure. There is a required family education component. The program is staffed by an addictions team and a therapist.

Locations: Bartholomew and Monroe counties

Recovery House

Ages: 18 and older

Recovery House is a co-ed residential facility intended for Day Treatment clients who are unable to stay clean and sober or who do not have a safe and sober place to live while in Day Treatment. Recovery House provides the structure and supervision that some clients need to get clean and sober. This is the most restrictive option, and participants stay only while they are participating in the Day Treatment program. Recovery House is staffed with an Addictions Team and an Addictions Therapist.

Location: Monroe County

Relapse Process

Ages: 18 and older

Relapse Process group is designed for clients who have relapsed or are having trouble staying clean and sober. The group focuses heavily on 12-step program involvement as well as topics such as triggers, dysfunctional thinking, and coping skills.

Locations: Bartholomew and Monroe counties

Substance Abuse Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP)

Ages: 18 and older

IOP is designed for adult clients who have a dependence diagnosis, have been through the detox process, and are seeking to address therapeutic issues while maintaining family, work and other daily commitments. Clients are introduced to 12-step programs and are expected to attend 3 weekly meetings and obtain a sponsor, complete steps 1-3 and present first step in group, begin a comprehensive look at drug use and the impact of use on life, identify and practice skills related to stress management, healthy coping and sober recreation. The program meets 3 days each week for 2 hour sessions. Random urine drug screens are a part of the program. The program is staffed with addictions team members and a therapist.

Locations: Bartholomew, Decatur, Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

Business Services

Employee Assistance Program (EAP)

Ages: All Ages

Employers contract for specific EAP program components which generally include 3 to 5 visits for the employee and any eligible dependents. Specific services available are:

- Assessment
- Brief, focused interventions for stress, depression, anxiety, marital/relationship issues, parent/child issues, school matters, drug and alcohol abuse, work-related issues, grief and loss, and more
- Crisis Intervention Stress Management
- Employer/employee relations consultations
- Communication and leadership training
- Wellness education
- Legal and financial consultation
- Behavioral health benefit plans
- Lifeworks® web-based information about health and mental health topics

Locations: Centerstone outpatient locations or EAP network provider locations

Case Management Services

ACT (Assertive Case Management)

Ages: 18 and older

ACT provides intensive case management and treatment through a team of mental health professionals, including a psychiatrist, nurse, therapist, case manager, addiction specialist and vocational specialist.

Locations: Bartholomew, Jackson and Jennings, Monroe and Morgan counties

Case Management Services

Ages: 18 and older

Case management provides home-based support for those with severe behavioral health disorders, including monitoring and oversight of symptoms and progress, assistance with accessing needed community resources, consumer education and advocacy, crisis intervention, and life skill training. Case management also includes monitoring of day-to-day activities and assistance in receiving medical care when needed.

Locations: Bartholomew, Brown, Clark, Decatur, Jackson, Jefferson, Jennings, Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

Child and Family Services

Children First

Ages: Parents of children age 18 and younger

Children First is a two-hour educational program for divorcing parents with children designed to help them understand the potential effects of divorce upon children and how to help children cope with those effects.

Locations: Bartholomew, Jackson, and Jennings counties

Children's Partial Hospitalization Program

Ages: 13 and younger

The Partial Hospitalization Program is a structured therapeutic environment designed for children in second through sixth grade who are experiencing significant behavioral and emotional difficulties while interacting in groups of other children at school in classroom, playground and lunchroom activities.

Locations: Lawrence, Monroe and Morgan counties

Dino Club

Ages: 17 and younger

The Dino Club is an evidenced-based group treatment program for young children with behavioral health issues. Children and their families learn coping techniques, communication skills, and strategies for dealing with school and home challenges.

Locations: Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

Family Support

Ages: All Ages

Offered to families of Centerstone clients, this includes education about mental illness, case management and family therapy when appropriate. The program also makes referrals to the local National Alliance for the Mentally Ill and Mental Health Association family support groups.

Locations: Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

Family Support Services

Ages: 18 and younger

Family Support Services provides home-based treatment to school-aged children who have been identified as "at risk" for abuse or neglect. The purpose of the program is to break the cycle of abuse, overcome developmental delays, restructure family and physical environment and improve parenting skills.

Locations: Bartholomew, Brown, Clark, Decatur, Jackson, Jefferson and Jennings counties

Functional Family Therapy

Ages: 19 and younger

Functional Family Therapy is an evidenced-based treatment program that consists of family therapy and case management to address a variety of behavioral health disorders in older children and adolescents. The program works with families and adolescents experiencing problems with juvenile delinquency to reduce recidivism by eliminating repeated arrests for similar or worse crimes.

Locations: Bartholomew, Brown, Clark, Decatur, Jackson, Jefferson, Jennings, Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

System of Care

Ages: 19 and younger

A System of Care provides wraparound services through community involvement and resources with the goal of keeping children and adolescents who are not successful with standard interventions and their families in a home/community setting. The System of Care team uses a strengths-based approach and family-driven care to develop the wraparound family plans.

Locations: Bartholomew, Decatur, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

School-Based Services**School-Based Counseling**

Ages: children in school

The program provides on-site counselors to help students cope with problems. It combines individual and group counseling with parent and teacher consultations. Priority is given to students in special education classes and severe or moderate behavioral intervention classes, or those at risk of entering these classes.

Locations: Bartholomew, Brown, Clark, Decatur, Jackson, Jefferson, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

Group Therapy

Aftercare Group

Ages: 18 and older

Aftercare is an 8-week group which is intended to support, monitor and integrate the information clients have learned in IOP. Completion of IOP or its equivalent is required. Clients must be attending 3 12-step meetings a week and have a sponsor. This group is not intended for clients who are chronic substance users with difficulty remaining sober despite multiple treatment episodes and substantial consequences.

Locations: Bartholomew, Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

Anger Management Group

Ages: 18 and older

This open-educational group focuses on controlling angry behavior. The group objectives include identifying personal triggers, acquiring knowledge about anger, the difference between anger and aggression, the impact of alcohol or drugs on anger and behavioral skills, including time-outs, self-talk, relaxation techniques, communication skills, problem-solving skills and assertiveness. The program lasts eight weeks.

Locations: Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

Batterers' Treatment Group

Ages: 18 and older - males

This is a 26 week group for men who commit domestic abuse. The program emphasizes social skills development as well as examines attitudes, thoughts, and belief systems to break the cycles that endorse and foster battering. Centerstone works closely with the criminal justice system, Middle Way House (a Bloomington-based women's shelter), and research to deliver effective treatment. The program also addresses the prevention of relapses and helps clients develop a plan to avoid them. An initial evaluation by the Centerstone team will determine the individual's treatment needs.

Location: Monroe County

Brief Intensive Group

Ages: 12 and older

This is a six-week therapy group to help a person's identification of problem usage and develop a "change" plan. This program is also available for Spanish-speaking clients.

Locations: Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

Brief Intensive Group (BIG)

Ages: 18 and older

BIG is a six-week group that focuses on the impact of drugs and alcohol in the client's life. The group uses substance information and drug education, in addition to screens and other measures, to provide clients with resources to drink more responsibly and evaluate their use, identifying harmful or problematic use patterns.

Locations: Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

Child of Alcoholic (COA) groups

Ages: 17 and younger

This support group for the children of alcoholics meets at the same time as an adult group for Parents in Recovery.

Locations: Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

Coping Skills Group

Ages: 18 and older

This skills-based group provides information and strategies to clients who have a hard time problem-solving daily stresses. Clients learn how to use the tools they have learned in group and are expected to apply them in their daily activities.

Locations: Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

Dual Diagnosis Group

Ages: 18 and older

This group meets daily for clients with co-occurring psychiatric and addiction disorders.

Location: Monroe County

Living Sober

Ages: 18 and older

Living Sober is offered as a 12- week or a 24-week group. The groups are intended to support, monitor and integrate the information clients have learned in IOP. Clients are expected to attend 3 AA/NA meetings a week and have weekly sponsor contact while in treatment. The group focuses on how to manage the ongoing challenges related to triggers, cravings, risky situations, sober support, and life stresses.

Locations: Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

Mood Management Group

Ages: 18 and older

This group is available for any client with mood symptoms that significantly interfere with their quality of life. The group is a therapy-based cognitive behavioral therapy program and addresses core beliefs and cognitive restructuring.

Locations: Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

Parenting Skills Group

Ages: Parents of children 17 and younger

This group uses parenting skills from an evidence-based parenting program and meets for 12 sessions and childcare is provided under terms of the grant.

Location: Morgan County

Relapse Prevention Group

Ages: 18 and older

This therapy group focuses on identifying relapse triggers and developing coping strategies for maintaining sobriety.

Locations: Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

Stress Management Group

Ages: 18 and older

This 10-week group helping clients to manage acute or long-term life stresses, which can include the stress of dealing with mental health issues. The group focuses on addressing cognitive distortions specific to anxiety disorders.

Locations: Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

Substance Abuse Education Group (SAEC)

Ages: 12 and older

SAEC is a 4-lecture class that educates participants about aspects of substance use. The class focuses on the effects substance use has on an individual, society, families and employment. Stress management, quality of life and myths of substance use are also covered. SAEC is for individuals who do not show signs of abuse/dependence, but have been experimentally using.

Location: Monroe County

Thinking for a Change

Ages: 18 and older

This highly-structured CBT group teaches clients how to solve problems through cognitive restructuring and social skills interventions. This program teaches clients to identify their emotions, thinking, beliefs, attitudes and values over the course of 22 lessons. Appropriate for individuals who do not make good decisions, demonstrate poor internal control, are lacking in social skills, and/or exhibit problematic/petty criminal behavior. Group runs for 11 weeks and meet two times a week.

Locations: Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

Residential Services

Adult Long-Term Group Living (less than 24-hour supervision)

Ages: 18 and older

A variety of housing options are offered for clients in Residential Services. Services offered vary by facility and staffing levels. Some sites offer on-site medication monitoring and life skills training. Residents in these facilities can be served on an outpatient basis by Case Managers from Residential Services, Community Support Services, or the Assertive Community Treatment Team, based on resident need.

Locations: Bartholomew, Jackson, Monroe and Morgan counties

Adult Transitional Group Homes (24-hour supervision)

Ages: 18 and older

These homes provide a high level of supervision for seriously mentally ill adults while focusing on the skills needed to transition to more independent living. On-site services include case management, life skills training, medication monitoring and more. Residents in these facilities are expected to engage in Partial Hospitalization Programs/Clubhouse Programs or to obtain employment or volunteer work during their stay. Guidelines on length of stay vary at each facility.

Locations: Bartholomew, Jennings, and Monroe counties

Long-Term Subsidized Apartments

Ages: 18 and older

Long-term, stable housing is provided for residents meeting HUD income and disability criteria. A diverse array of services is provided on an outpatient basis to residents by Case Managers from Residential Services, Community Support Services, or the Assertive Community Treatment Team. Rent is capped at 30% of income.

Locations: Bartholomew, Decatur, Jackson, Jefferson, Jennings, Lawrence, Monroe and Morgan counties

Residential Services

Ages: 18 and older

Centerstone has an extensive residential services continuum for adults with serious mental illness who are receiving clinical services from our clinics. Both transitional and permanent housing is available with varying levels of accompanying supportive services. Centerstone has over 316 residential beds in 27 facilities. Forty-six of these beds are reserved for clients meeting the HUD definition of homelessness.

Locations: Bartholomew, Decatur, Jackson, Jefferson, Jennings, Lawrence, Monroe, and Morgan counties

Short-Term Residential Addictions

Ages: 18 and older

A short-term housing program for men and women participating in substance abuse treatment programs. Evening and night-time supervision is provided, along with meals. Clients are expected to be in treatment during the day. The average length of stay is 14 days.

Location: Monroe County

Sub-Acute Care

Ages: 18 and older

A sub-acute residential program offering psychiatric stabilization services in order to prevent hospitalization or to provide a transition after hospitalization. Day nursing and psychiatric care, symptom stabilization, life skills training, medication education, and case management are among the services offered. The length of stay varies based on individual needs. Maximum stay is one year.

Location: Monroe County

Therapeutic Children's Group Homes

Ages: 6-19

Therapeutic group homes provide short or long-term residential placements for children. The program offers a structured, nurturing environment and provides crisis intervention, assessment, counseling, parenting and aftercare support.

Locations: Bartholomew and Jefferson counties

Specialized Services

Assertive Community Treatment Team (ACT)

Ages: 18 and older

ACT is an evidence-based, intensive, community-based, proactive service designed to prevent institutionalization (jail or hospital) or homelessness among adults with severe and persistent mental illness who have not responded to or benefited from traditional treatment. Treatment is provided by an interdisciplinary team which includes psychiatrist, social work, nurse, substance abuse specialist, case managers, addiction specialist and vocational staff.

Locations: Bartholomew, Jackson and Jennings, Monroe and Morgan counties

Batterers Treatment Program

Ages: 18 and older

This 26-week program for men who commit domestic abuse offers therapy-based intervention which confronts behavior and directs attention toward social skill development. It also offers examination of attitudes, thoughts, and belief systems in order to break the cycles that endorse and foster battering. The program works closely with the criminal justice system, a women's shelter, and research to deliver effective treatment.

Locations: Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

BET (Business Empowerment Team)

Ages: 18 and older

The Business Empowerment Team is a vocational counseling program for individuals with serious mental illness or those referred by Indiana Office of Vocational Rehabilitation. It is designed to assist in the development of pre-employment skills, resume writing, interviewing and relationship skills, as well as providing job development and job coaching. Program staff may also provide on-site skill building and support.

Locations: Bartholomew, Decatur, Jackson, Jefferson and Jennings counties

Clubhouse

Ages: 18 and older

The Clubhouse program provides an environment of community, friendship, education, meaningful work and support for individuals who experience behavioral health disorders. With the belief that every member can sufficiently recover from the effects of mental illness and lead a personally satisfying life, the goal of the program is to rebuild the lives of participants.

Locations: Bartholomew and Jackson counties

Day Therapy/Bridges Program

Ages: 18 and older

This treatment program for seriously mentally ill individuals focuses on achieving greater independence through personal development (self-esteem, socialization skills and communication), skill development (money management, food preparation, nutrition and personal and home care), and leisure education (exercise, artistic expression and other recreational activities).

Locations: Bartholomew, Brown, Clark, Decatur, Jackson, Jefferson and Jennings counties

Partial Hospitalization Programs for Adults with Serious Mental Illness

Ages: 18 and older

Partial Hospitalization Programs (PHP) offer daily life-skills training, medical education or psychotherapy groups for consumers who need structure and activity to stabilize and manage their illness. Most programs include dual diagnosis components using the IDDT model for consumers with both mental illness and substance abuse problems.

Locations: Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan and Owen counties

PASAR Evaluations

Ages: Adults in a nursing home facility
