Centerstone is building a stronger foundation for the future. We're excited about the momentum and the opportunities it brings."

Centerstone is a nonprofit health system providing mental health and substance use disorder treatments. Services are available nationally through the operation of outpatient clinics, residential programs, the use of telehealth, and an inpatient hospital.

Accomplishments

- Selected as one of 14 Illinois community mental health centers for inclusion in the state's Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) demonstration grant.
- Secured two grants from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) to improve and develop the CCBHC model in Alton and Carbondale. These grants will provide \$8 million of support to Centerstone over the next four years.
- Received \$263,660 in funding from the Illinois Department of Human Services allowing us to transition to a community supported employment model for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities, while reducing the use of subminimum wage services.
- Launched Centerstone's Health Home model in West Frankfort, Carbondale, and Marion which will provide essential community-based services for adults with serious mental illness. This is a new service that fills a significant community need in areas where there have been little to no resources for this population.
- Hosted the inaugural Illinois Life;Story 5K Walk and Run event in Marion, raising more than \$40,000 for suicide prevention and crisis resources.
- Regional Chief Executive Officer, Anne Tyree, was named 2024 YWCA Woman of Distinction by the YWCA of Southwestern Illinois.
- Centerstone's Manager of Grant Implementation, Stephanie Dalton, spoke at a congressional briefing attended by congressional staff that represented the U.S. House of Representatives Committee on Ways & Means, which has jurisdiction over child welfare programs. Dalton was invited to speak about Centerstone's Regional Partnership Grant and the impact that the project has made on families in the state of Illinois.

Centerstone's Health Home program expands integrated care and recovery services to rural communities where there were zero community based services or supports. Centerstone's Health Home program seeks to collaboratively equip adults who have moderate to high acuity needs, ranging from co-occurring behavioral health disorders, physical health needs, and/or high risk of developing a chronic health condition, with the tools, skills, and community connections they need. Treatment is tailored to patient needs, goals, and life with goals being accomplished through the use of both individual and group sessions.

Currently, Centerstone's Health Home program is serving Illinoisans in Calhoun, Franklin, Greene, Jackson, Jersey, Madison, and Williamson counties. Services include case management, community support, medication monitoring, and primary care.
