Indiana Impact Report

Centerstone is a nonprofit health system providing mental health and substance use disorder treatments. Services are available nationally through the operation of outpatient clinics, residential programs, the use of telehealth, and an inpatient hospital.

Accomplishments

- Received official designation from the State of Indiana as a Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) demonstration site across 15 counties.
- Launched mobile crisis response services at Centerstone's Stride Center in Columbus and exceeded total number of patient visits by 92% over fiscal year 2022 – almost doubling the visits we're providing.
- Opened an in-house, full-service pharmacy in Columbus, Indiana as part of our whole health initiative. This will allow easier and quicker access to pharmacy services for Centerstone patients.
- Received a \$1 million capital funding grant from the Indiana State
 Department of Mental Health and Addictions for physical plant
 improvements to our mental health group homes and to replace our
 Blair House group home in Bloomington with an improved facility in
 Ellettsville, Indiana.
- Opened two new recovery transitional housing sites in Columbus and Richmond as a result of receiving state and federal opioid settlement dollars. These sites provide substance use disorder support and programming as well as intensive outpatient treatment options.
- Awarded \$400,000 from Indiana University Health Foundation to support care delivery at our Bloomington Stride Center.
- Served 93 children through Centerstone's therapeutic foster care program, with 60 new admissions, 11 adoptions, and 28 reunifications.
- Increased school-based services by 34%, drastically expanding our ability to serve more children and families with mental health needs.

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Highlights

This year, Indiana was selected as one of ten new states to join the Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) demonstration program. An innovative new way for delivering life-changing care, the CCBHC model provides integrated, sustainably financed, and comprehensive care for mental health and substance use disorders. Centerstone's participation in this program ensures that individuals receive the care they need, regardless of their ability to pay, extending services to those who are underserved, uninsured, or on Medicaid and Medicare, as well as active-duty military personnel and veterans.

CCBHC operates under a Medicaid prospective payment system (PPS), which provides funding based on anticipated costs. This structure allows for the expansion of services that meet the unique needs of each community. By participating in the CCBHC model, Centerstone is able to better address critical gaps in mental health care, offering comprehensive treatment and support to some of the most vulnerable populations in the state.

The CCBHC model has already proven effective across 46 states, leading to increased access to care, a reduction in hospitalizations, homelessness, and incarceration, and improved recruitment and retention of behavioral health staff. Additionally, CCBHCs foster innovative partnerships with law enforcement, schools, and hospitals, creating a more holistic approach to care that enhances community well-being.

Centerstone is proud to be part of Indiana's CCBHC designation, serving 15 counties across the state, including Bartholomew, Brown, Decatur, Fayette, Jackson, Jefferson, Jennings, Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan, Owen, Randolph, Rush, Union, and Wayne. We look forward to the positive impact these expanded services will bring, helping our communities thrive through better access to mental health and substance use treatment.
