Centerstone's Military Services Impact Report

Centerstone is a nonprofit health system providing mental health and substance use disorder treatments. Services are available nationally through the operation of outpatient clinics, residential programs, the use of telehealth, and an inpatient hospital.

Accomplishments

- Partnered with the Gary Sinise Foundation and their Snowball Express to send more than 1,800 Gold Star families to Disney World. Centerstone was the premier mental health provider during this event, offering crisis response, grief counseling, and other overarching mental health support to these families of fallen service members and first responders during this event.
- Dr. Blas Villalobos was selected to receive the prestigious California Community College Distinguished Alumni Award for 2023 by the Community College League of California. The award recognizes career accomplishments and community service among community college graduates.
- Awarded a \$432,000 USAA grant for counseling sessions, evidence-based treatments, and provider training with an invitation to apply for year two to expand reach nationwide.
- Received 2023 Military Times Best for Vets Designation through Military Times Magazine. Best for Vets is a comprehensive annual ranking of the country's best employers and organization with military-connected employment programs, benefits, and support efforts and highlights the efforts those organizations make to recruit, retain, and support military service members, military spouses and military caregivers.
- Invited to become a member of the National Center for Missing & Exploited children resource directory through our membership in the Family Advocacy Outreach Network. Through this membership, Centerstone is positioned to support military and first responder families who have experienced child exploitation, victimization, search, and reunification, expanding access to timely, evidence-based services to families in their most critical time of need.
- Received a \$250,000 grant from the Outlaw State of Kind Fund. Through the Community Foundation of Middle Tennessee, country music artist Chris Stapleton has established this fund to support a variety of causes that are close to his heart.
- Received the Veteran Ready Organization designation from PsychArmor, the leader in military culture training, which addresses the unique needs and strengths of service members, veterans, and their families, while also ensuring the provision of evidence-based therapeutic interventions.
- Partnered with First Responders Children's Foundation to provide 10 free mental health sessions for children of first responders in Tennessee including children of hospital workers, 911 dispatchers, paramedics, police officers, or fire fighters.
