Centerstone Appoints Robison Executive Director for Military Services

Experienced industry leader tapped to lead military services for behavioral health provider

Robison will take over the executive director position recently held by COL (Ret) Kent Crossley who will be retiring in September.

With more than 18 years of behavioral health and management experience, Robison will oversee Centerstone's military-related services, programming, operations, business development and fundraising activities. Robison previously served as the lead clinician for Steven A. Cohen Military Family Clinic at Centerstone and prior to that as director of clinical services for Centerstone's Military Services.

Robison first joined Centerstone in 2007 as a behavioral health worker in Pediatric Integrated Care before establishing her own private behavioral health practice in 2012. Robison is active in the military community. She is a military spouse, a military parent and has collaborated with numerous military related organizations throughout her professional career.

"Jodie has emerged as a gifted leader at Centerstone over the years with her steadfast commitment to veterans and their families," said David Guth, Chief Executive Officer of Centerstone. "Her dedication to the delivery of high quality care has been instrumental in helping us shape Centerstone's military services outreach.
